He is a specialist in international commercial and investment arbitration, with a particular focus on cases involving Europe and Latin America. He has represented clients in disputes arising out of contracts and investment treaties in the electricity sector, renewable energy, construction, oil & gas, mining and telecommunications sectors. He has experience in cases involving multiple jurisdictions and procedural rules and has appeared before ICC, ICSID, GAFTA and *ad hoc* UNCITRAL arbitral tribunals. Mr. García Represa also serves as arbitrator. He is a member of the recent ICC Task Force on Arbitration of Climate Change Related Disputes; and the President of the French chapter of the Club Español del Arbitraje (CEA).

Prof. Malik Laazouzi is the founder of the LL.M. AWArDS. He has published extensively about investment arbitration, international commercial arbitration and international business litigation. His recent engagements include teaching international commercial arbitration at Notre Dame University Law School (2023), giving a special course (2019) and the general course (2022) at the Arbitration Academy or teaching at the Hague Academy of International Law (2023).
